- Gina Nadira Miller (née Singh) is a Guyanese-British business owner and activist who initiated the 2016 R (Miller) v Secretary of State for Exiting the European Union court case against the British government over its authority to implement Brexit without approval from Parliament.
- In September 2019 she successfully challenged the government's prorogation of Parliament.
- She founded the True and Fair Campaign in 2012, calling for an end to financial misconduct in the investment and pension industries.
- In October 2017, Miller was named by Powerlist as the "UK's most influential black person"







 David Adetayo Olusoga OBE is a British Nigerian historian, writer and broadcaster, who is currently a professor of public history at the University of Manchester. His recent TV series include Black and British: A Forgotten History and the BAFTA award-winning Britain's Forgotten Slave Owners.

 At five years old, Olusoga migrated to the UK with his mother and grew up in Gateshead, Tyne and Wear. He was one of a very few non-white people living on that council estate. By the time he was 14, the National Front had attacked his house on more than one occasion, requiring police protection for him and his family. They were eventually forced to leave as a result of the racism. He later attended the University of Liverpool to study the history of slavery.
